PREFACE

Welcome to AILA's new resource for paralegals working in the field of immigration law: AILA's Toolbox for Immigration Paralegals. This Toolbox covers fundamental immigration law and procedure and is intended to serve as a daily reference tool to help immigration paralegals provide more effective assistance to their supervising attorneys.
